

# NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON TAX INCREASE

A tax rate of \$0.702970 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of City of Queen City.

PROPOSED TAX RATE	\$0.702970 per \$100
NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE	\$0.682970 per \$100
VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE	\$0.727645 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2025 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for City of Queen City from the same properties in both the 2024 tax year and the 2025 tax year.

The voter-approval rate is the highest tax rate that City of Queen City may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that City of Queen City is proposing to increase property taxes for the 2025 tax year.

A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON September 11, 2025 AT 5:45 pm AT Queen City City Hall 601 Loop 236 Queen City TX 75572.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, City of Queen City is not required to hold an election at which voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the of City of Queen City at their offices or by attending the public hearing mentioned above.
